





The Environment Council organized a **BEST OUT OF WASTE** competition for all the students of our school.








The school yoga teacher conducted the sessions, as described below:

### **3. Robotics**







## **Annual Fest 2020 organized by DPS Dwarka**

The participants poured their hearts out and gave their best while enunciating the topic in hand. The contest aimed at exercising young orators to hone the speaking skills with articulation and ease.







## Inter Section English Debate Competition- Class VIII:





## RENDEZVOUS DE JURIS '20 -

**Indicium (Moot Court):** The event not only instilled confidence in the students but also honed their oratory skills and showcased their aptitude for law.



It was under his able guidance and tenure that the first IIT, IISc, School of Planning and Agriculture and the University Grants Commission were established, because he felt and strongly believed that everyone should be provided with education to sensitize and make people perceive about the happenings of the world around them. The Vice President of India Venkaiah Naidu paid his tributes to the freedom fighter and nationalist, writing, "He will be always remembered for his enduring contribution in the field of education & for relentlessly striving for national unity". Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru referred to Maulana Abul Kalam as Mir-i-Karawan, “A very brave and gallant gentleman, a finished product of the culture that, in these days, pertains to few.” A must mention of Mahatma Gandhi remarked about Abul Kalam Azad by counting him as “A person of the caliber of Plato, Aristotle and Pythagoras”. In order to remember him and his contributions in making India a better country, we celebrate National Education Day.

The first step in knowledge is to listen, then to be quite and attentive, then to preserve it, then to put it into practice and finally spread it. The object of education is to pr spear the youth to educate themselves throughout their lives. Education is knowledge based- the more you know about it, the more you like it. The less you know about it, the more you will dwindle.

## 40th Dr. Vidya Topa Memorial Interschool Hindi Debate Competition






## 46th Amala Chatterjee Memorial Inter-School English Debate Academic Year- 2020-2021




### Earthquake-mock drill

An 'Earthquake Safety Programme' in all three wings was organized by the Disaster Management Club on 25 th Nov., 2020 – Wednesday - about “How to protect yourself and ensure safety in case of an earthquake”.

Children were briefed on how to ensure safety and protect themselves during an earthquake if inside the classroom or school building. Following safety tips were shared with them:

- a. If you are inside, stay inside. DO NOT run outside or to other rooms during shaking. In most situations, you will reduce your chance of injury from falling objects and even building collapse if you immediately.
- b. DROP down onto your hands and knees before the earthquake knocks you down. This Position protects you from falling but allows you to still move if necessary.
- c. COVER your head and neck (and your entire body if possible) under the shelter of a sturdy table or desk. If there is no shelter nearby, get down near an interior wall or next to low-lying furniture that won't fall on you, and cover your head and neck with your arms and hands.
- d. HOLD ON to your shelter (or to your head and neck) until the shaking stops. Be prepared move with your shelter if the shaking shifts it around.

This pandemic made wearing mask a daily life necessity for all of us. So this year mask designing competition 'Mask-a-thon' was held for students of class 8th.


Story writing competition 'weave a story' was held for class 9th students.

The aim of conducting Biologica'20 was to kindle the spark of knowledge and to help students to view the subject from different perspectives. The event was full of joy and information and was a great success.






## ENVIRONMENT FEST- TENALACH







