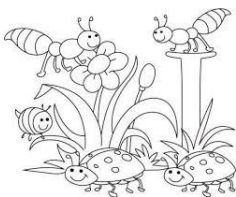
Dear Parent,

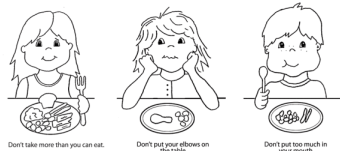

ETIQUETTES WEEK 15th July -19th July 2019

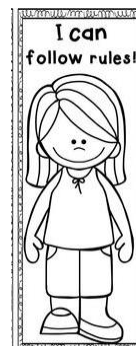

Teaching our kids to use good manners is also one simple way to instill the values of kindness and respect—which the world needs now more than ever. The key is to start early and be consistent. Most parents want their children to know how to act, but many aren't sure where to start. The most important things to consider are to set an example by being the perfect role model. The Etiquettes Week will attempt to reiterate the importance of good manners and in the development of a well-rounded personality.



Manners Matter!

15th July 2019 (Monday) - The Perfect Hosts - Our little ones will be taught the

nuances of laying the table properly with style and ease. The children will bring a small plate, spoon, fork, knife, napkin and a glass from home and will be guided by the teachers to lay



their own table following proper table etiquettes. They will learn to keep the napkin on their lap and pass food around saying 'please' and 'thank you'.

16th July 2019 (Tuesday) - **Manners Role Play** - The children will be involved in a role play and basic etiquettes like answering the doorbell/telephone, greeting a friend for a play date, greeting elders etc. will be taught to the children. A special story enactment based on the theme 'good manners' will be presented for our little ones.

17th July 2019 (Wednesday) - **Each class will prepare a song/ rhyme on etiquettes and present it on the stage, helping them boost their confidence and remove stage fright.**

18th July 2019 (Thursday) - **Hands are to spread happiness** - Kids will be taught to keep their hands to themselves by not pushing, invading others' space and will also learn that the same hands can spread happiness by helping, caring, sharing and standing for the others. The children will be asked to make a small picture of their friend and gift it to that child saying, "thank you for being my friend."

19th July 2019 (Friday) - **Everyone's Invited** - To teach the children the importance of sharing a small party will be organized in each section. The children shall share food with their classmates and also with the other classes. A special assembly on etiquettes will be put up by the children of Pre Primary C.
