A Campus for Excellence: Our Infrastructure

Delhi Public School, Mathura Road, is situated on an expansive 15-acre lush green campus in the heart of New Delhi and is a member of the Indian Public School Conference.

Our world-class facilities are designed to support a holistic educational journey, blending traditional learning with modern innovation.

1. General Campus Facilities

- **Specialized Academic Wings:** The school is divided into three distinct blocks—Primary, Middle, and Senior—to provide age-appropriate environments for all students.
- **Performance & Assembly Hubs:** Features include the **KG Hall**, **Multi-Purpose Halls (MPH)**, and an **Amphitheatre** for cultural events and school gatherings.
- **Safety & Security:** The entire campus is under constant **CCTV surveillance** to ensure a secure environment.
- **Cafeteria:** The school's cafeteria serves wholesome nutritious meals and snacks on cash payment at fixed rates subject to prevailing conditions.
- **Health and Wellness:** Three well-equipped clinics, with doctors and nurses look after the needs of the students. An ambulance with an attendant and driver is stationed at the clinic. Every student undergoes medical check-up; parents / guardians are informed if the child needs specific medical attention. An individual medical record is maintained.
- **Bookstore:** All school books and other articles of stationery may be purchased from the school bookstore which remains open during school hours. However, it is not mandatory.
- **Uniform:** School uniform may be purchased from the school uniform shop which remains open during school hours. However, it is not mandatory.

2. Academic Infrastructure

- **Smart Classrooms:** Computer aided teaching is facilitated across subjects and classes through the use of Smart Boards in every classroom.
- **Libraries:** A vast knowledge hub consisting of two major libraries holding **67,000+ books** (40,000 in Senior and 27,000 in Junior). Both are complemented by a **Digital Library** accessible via an online repository.
- **Modern Laboratories:** Specialized Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Geography, Food Production, Artificial intelligence and Computer Laboratories

- **Innovation Hub (ATL):** An **Atal Tinkering Lab** featuring 3D printers, robotics kits, and STEM tools for hands-on experimentation.

Student Prefectorial Body

Social leadership and responsibility are best learnt through active participation. A number of student appointments, selected after a careful scrutiny of their school records, are entrusted with various responsibilities and share the task of maintaining decorum in the school. Senior student appointments meet the Principal and Vice Principal periodically. The junior wing has a similar system of student appointments.

The various Clubs/ Councils have a selected group of students appointed from Class XII since they are Board examinees. The remaining Appointments are chosen from Class XI. The senior most appointments are the Head Boy and Head Girl under whose guidance the various groups perform their respective duties. Sports occupy a significant position and the sports appointments are important in promoting the spirit of sportsmanship.

This Prefectorial Body comprising nearly 75 members gets selected through an impartial, democratic process. It is voluntary and the selection procedure involves a detailed round of group discussion, 3 interview rounds and even a psychoanalysis test supervised by the Reps of Class XI and XII, the Club In-charge and Heads of Departments. In the final round the shortlisted candidates are interviewed by the Principal.

Once selected, the appointments are guided and supervised by faculty members appointed to their specific Club/Council to organise, and manage the year-long activities of the concerned Club/ Council. The ultimate aim is to give interested students the experience of working and managing a small group with specific objectives, thus shaping and honing leadership qualities which will hold them in good stead in the future.

Co-Curricular Activities

Education today has redefined itself into a blend of academic learning and personality development. The school too has moulded itself to give to the world a well-balanced, academically strong and socially aware citizen. - **Regular Interaction:** PTA meetings are held regularly throughout the academic year for every class. They provide a platform for parents and teachers to interact and discuss students' academic progress, behaviour, and overall development.
- **Benevolent Fund:** The PTA has established a Benevolent Fund to support students who lose an earning parent while studying at the school. This initiative helps children continue their education and has been widely appreciated, especially by young widows. Women seeking support may apply annually to the Principal and Secretary, PTA for exemption from tuition fees for their children.

Library

The school library is open to all bonafide students of the school during school hours. All classes are provided with one library period per week.

1. Students must carry their RFID cards. Books are issued for a fortnight.
2. Reference books, periodicals, journals, magazines are issued overnight.
3. Books marked, disfigured or damaged, will have to be replaced or paid for by the borrower.
4. The Library has an open shelf system and students must help to maintain order and organization in the different shelves. They must put the books back on the respective shelves after consultation, and not just anywhere.
5. Personal belongings, pens, pencils, etc. are strictly forbidden inside the library.
6. Books should be returned to the library on or before the date last stamped.
7. Fine for overdue books-Rs. 3 per day for general books and Rs. 5 for reference books.
8. Eatables are not allowed inside the library.

DIGITAL LIBRARY

A Digital Library, also called an online library, an internet library , a digital repository or a digital collection is an online database of digital objects. In today's digital age of knowledge and resource sharing, DPS Mathura Road has empowered its users through its digital content via the digital library. It gives the students and staff access to multiple content with a potentially infinite number of resources and selections at hand. It also provides access to an expansive collection of materials with increased convenience because users can access the library from anywhere with an internet connection. School Uniform

Students must wear clean, ironed and complete school uniforms daily. Non-adherence shall attract disciplinary action. Students are advised to follow the prescribed summer/winter/sports uniform schedule and attire.

For House Uniform, the dress code is given below:

Summer: House colour T-shirt with black track pants featuring house-coloured stripes

Winter: House colour T-shirt with black track pants featuring house-coloured stripes with Bottle Green School Jacket

School Uniform and Grooming Guidelines

Parents are expected to ensure that their wards are in proper school uniform, complete with RFID, before leaving home. Entry into school **without proper uniform is not permitted**, even after school hours or on holidays.

1. Uniform Requirements

- The prescribed school uniform must be worn on **all working days and during all school functions**.
- The school uniform (shirt, tie, belt and blazer) **must carry the school logo**.
- Students must carry **simple school bags only**.
- **Name tags** must be affixed to all uniform items to help recover them in case of loss or exchange during P.E., SUPW, Yoga or practice sessions.
- Students not found in proper uniform will be **sent back home** and an **external memo** will be issued. Strict compliance is mandatory.

2. House Uniform and Sports Attire

- It is **compulsory** to wear the **house uniform** on days when students have P.E. or Sports periods.
- Students of **Classes XI–XII** must carry their **sports kit and shoes** for Physical Education classes and **change back into their regular uniform after the period**.
- The same rule applies to students attending **dance practice, self-defence classes or any other co-curricular activity**.

3. Footwear and Winter Wear

- Proper footwear for both boys and girls, in summer and winter, is **black shoes only**.
- Shoes of any other colour or kind, including **chappals, floaters or high-heeled shoes**, are not permitted.
- **Jackets (other than school jackets) and sweatshirts are strictly prohibited**. If found wearing them, they will be **confiscated**.
- Students wearing **grey stockings** must secure them with **elastic garters** to prevent sagging at the ankles.

4. Trouser and Skirt Specifications

- Trousers must have a **straight cut**. Fancy styles such as **flares, bell bottoms, drain pipes, low-waist trousers**, etc., are **not permitted**.
- **Short skirts** are strictly prohibited.

5. Hair, Grooming and Appearance

- **All boys (except Sikhs)** must keep their hair **short** and be **clean-shaven**.
- Boys are not allowed to sport a beard without prior permission of the authorities, except on **religious or medical grounds**.
- Sikh boys should wear a **bottle-green turban/ patka**.
- **Girls must tie their hair neatly** using a **bottle-green/green hair band or ribbon**.
- **Use of hair gel is not permitted**.

6. Jewellery and Accessories

- Girls are **not permitted** to wear expensive (gold/diamond) or ostentatious jewellery such as **bracelets, dangling earrings or bangles**, nor are they allowed to apply nail **paint**.
- Nails must be **neatly trimmed**.
- **Boys are not allowed to wear earrings or studs**.
- The school will not be responsible for the loss or theft of any jewellery item.

7. Personal Cleanliness

- Students must maintain **personal cleanliness at all times** and turn up **neatly dressed** in the prescribed uniform.
- Students who are **improperly dressed or out of uniform** will be sent home.

Transport

I. School Bus Facilities & Security

The school provides air-conditioned, yellow, dedicated and branded school bus facilities. School transport is a facility provided by the school and not a matter of right. Bus facility for new admissions or students who change their residential address is subject to route availability.

Routes

- **Junior Routes (J Routes):**

Available for Classes Nursery to I on limited neighbourhood routes only. These buses are accompanied by a teaching staff member and a lady guard/attendant.

- **Senior Routes:**

Available for Classes II to XII for different parts of Delhi. Route details are available on the school website.

- **NCR Policy:**

No bus routes are available for NCR regions including Noida and Gurugram.

Safety & Monitoring

- As per CBSE guidelines, all school buses are equipped with CCTV cameras, GPS, and RFID monitoring systems.
- A lady guard/attendant is deployed in every bus, boarding from the first pick-up point and disembarking at the last drop-off point.
- In the morning, all bus users are dropped inside the school campus (vehicle parking area). In the afternoon, students board their respective buses from the same designated area.
- In case of an emergency, parents may contact the lady guard/attendant using the mobile numbers shared with them.
- Drivers and helpers are regularly monitored through breath analyser tests.
- Police verification of all drivers and helpers is conducted compulsorily.

II. Safety and Security of Students

School Bus Transport Advisory

The school encourages parents to opt for the school bus service as the preferred mode of transportation for students. School buses provide a safe, reliable, and well-managed commuting option, while also helping children develop independence and social skills. To ensure a secure and smooth transport experience for all students, the school strongly recommends the use of school bus facilities whenever possible.

Guidelines for Transport When School Bus Is Not Availed

In cases where the school bus facility has not been availed, parents are requested to ensure that the following guidelines are strictly followed before engaging a private van or taxi for their ward's commute:

- The number of students must not exceed the permitted seating capacity as per the norms applicable to the vehicle type.
- The driver must hold a valid driving licence issued by the licensing authorities of NCT of Delhi.
- The driver should have a minimum of five years of driving experience.
- The driver should not have been challaned more than once in a year for traffic violations, including drunk or dangerous driving under Sections 279 and 338 of IPC, 1860.
- The vehicle must comply with all permit conditions and be equipped with a speed governor, GPS tracking system, and a first-aid kit.
- A valid police verification report of the driver must be submitted.

III. Transport Rules for Students

- Students may board or alight only at their designated bus stops.
- Students must travel only in their allotted buses; requests for changes will not be entertained.
- At the end of the school day, students must board their respective buses immediately and remain seated until the bus departs.
- Students should walk in a queue while boarding or alighting and must not run, push, or jump on or off a moving bus.
- Discipline must be maintained at all times; any mischief that distracts the driver is strictly prohibited.
- Students must not stretch their hands or heads out of the bus windows.
- Students must cooperate with the transport staff and follow their instructions.
- Students should never stand in front of or behind a stationary bus.

Penalties

Violation of transport rules will invite strict disciplinary action, which may include debarring from bus facilities, suspension, or expulsion from the school.

IV. Discontinuation of Bus Service

- **Classes X and XII:**

Requests for discontinuation of bus service will not be entertained after the second quarter (July–September). If no request is received by the end of September, the bus fee for the entire academic session will be applicable.

- **All Other Classes:**

Bus service discontinuation requests must be submitted at least one month in advance.

V. Communication

Any issues, suggestions, or feedback related to transport services should be brought to the immediate notice of the Principal, Vice Principal, or the Transport Department.

RFID Attendance System

The School has introduced an RFID attendance system. All students are issued an RFID card free of cost; however, a nominal fee is payable for providing the service. The RFID card must be submitted back to the school in case of withdrawal or on passing out after completion of schooling. Students must compulsorily wear their RFID card properly at all times and not merely keep it in their school bag or pocket.

Parents will receive messages on their registered mobile numbers when a student follows the prescribed timings as per the details given below. The message will be delivered within 5 minutes of the student's arrival or departure from the school premises.

School Rules

Parents and students are advised to read the contents of the Almanac carefully and abide by the rules laid down by the school authorities strictly.

1. Students must carry the Almanac to school daily.
2. Students will not be allowed to enter the school on short leave. In case of a medical or any other emergency, the student may be allowed to leave the school. A gate pass will be issued from the office of the Vice Principal. The student must be accompanied by a parent or an authorised person.
3. Students who come to school on their own must reach the school punctually. The school gate will close at **7:20 a.m. (summer timings) and 8:00 a.m. (winter timings)**. **Late arrivals will be sent home immediately.** Habitual latecomers will invite disciplinary action as deemed fit by the school authorities.
4. Parents and guardians are not permitted to enter the school premises during school hours without a prior appointment. Appointments may be fixed by telephone at **011-43399200 / 241** or through the official email address provided on the school website.
5. Students are not allowed to bring mobile phones to school. Once confiscated, such items will not be returned. Electronic watches and all other electronic devices are strictly prohibited. Students must not carry any electronic communication device capable of storing, recording, playing audio-visual content, transmitting or receiving images, or providing unfiltered internet access, such as iPads, pen drives, DVD/CD players, gaming consoles, handheld PCs, smartphones, laptops, tablets, or similar gadgets. Unmonitored use of any electronic device is strictly prohibited as per CBSE directions.
6. Students must not bring cigarettes, e-cigarettes, e-hookah, deodorants, perfumes, explosive materials, crackers, sharp tools, or knives to school. Parents are advised to check their ward's school bag before departure. Non-compliance will invite strict disciplinary action.
7. Buying, selling, or using e-cigarettes, hookah, tobacco, vape products, or similar substances in or within a **100-yard radius** of the school campus is strictly prohibited and punishable under the **Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COTPA), 2003**.
8. Complaints related to bullying, smoking, or sexual abuse may be lodged at the email IDs provided under Safety and Security (Page 26). Complaint boxes are also available within the school premises.
9. Students may avail of the **Accidental Insurance** facility provided by the school.
10. Changing classrooms between periods must be done in an orderly and silent manner. Students should not leave the classroom unnecessarily at the end of every period.
11. Students are advised to use the washrooms during the home room period or change of periods and must return to class within **two minutes**. In emergencies, students must inform the concerned teacher and return within **two to three minutes**.
12. No books other than textbooks or library books, and no magazines, should be brought to school.
13. Lending or borrowing of money or articles is strictly prohibited.
14. Students who come escorted must not leave the school before the escort arrives. In case of delay, they must report to the school security officer at the reception.

15. **Students are not permitted to use the school telephone. In emergencies, the Class Teacher, Representatives, or Coordinators will contact parents at the earliest.**
16. Celebration of birthdays or festivals within the school campus is not permitted. Parents should not send cakes, sweets, or gifts. **Birthday bumps are a punishable offence.**
17. Staff and students must follow the **Green Rules** to maintain clean and green surroundings. Littering with disposable tumblers, papers, polythene bags, or single-use plastic items is strictly prohibited.
18. Students must keep classrooms, school buildings, and the campus clean. Waste must be disposed of in dustbins. Plucking or damaging plants and flowers is prohibited.
19. Students are expected to respect school property. No student should damage / be involved in damaging any school furniture; write or draw anything on the walls or in any way damage things belonging to others. Any damage—intentional or accidental—must be reported immediately to the Class Teacher, Class Representatives, Coordinators, Vice Principals, or Principal.
20. DPS Mathura Road students must be polite at all times and remember that their conduct reflects the image of the school. Students should greet teachers whenever they meet them.
21. Proper care of Smart Boards must be ensured. Students must not tamper with them. The class will be collectively responsible for any damage caused.
22. Damaging RFID card readers or CCTV cameras is strictly prohibited and will invite severe disciplinary action.
23. **The school is not responsible for loss of personal belongings.** Students are advised not to bring valuable items such as expensive watches, jewellery, cash, or costly stationery.
24. DPS Mathura Road provides education from Pre-School to Class XII. Seniors are expected to treat juniors with care and affection, while juniors must show respect towards seniors.
25. **School fees must be paid by cheque, demand draft, or online within the stipulated time.**
26. Students are not permitted to visit kiosks outside the school premises. Violations will attract punishment as per school rules.
27. Students using the school bus must maintain discipline. Indiscipline will lead to withdrawal of bus facilities. **Refer to Transport Rules in the Almanac.** Students indulging in aggressive or violent behaviour will not be allowed to use the school bus and must be dropped and picked up by parents.
28. A clinic proforma duly signed by the Class Teacher or Subject Teacher must be carried by students visiting the clinic during school hours.
29. Vaccination records must be submitted at the beginning of the academic session.
30. Canteen facilities are available only during break time or after school hours (subject to prevailing conditions).
31. Students must comply with all instructions issued by school authorities at all times.
32. **Children are not allowed to take photographs of any friend or student, teacher, Vice Principals or Principal in the school campus without his/her prior permission. They are not allowed to upload any such material on any social site without prior permission of the concerned student or teacher.**

33. Use of unfair means during examinations will invite disciplinary action as decided by the school authorities.
34. The school reserves the right to suspend or take strict disciplinary action against any student whose academic progress is unsatisfactory or whose conduct is detrimental to others.

Prohibited Practices (As per Directorate of Education)

No student shall indulge in the following:

1. Absence from classes without permission
2. Misbehaviour towards teachers or school staff
3. Disobedience of lawful instructions
4. Intentional disturbance of classes
5. Eve-teasing or misbehaviour towards girl students
6. Bringing unauthorised persons or articles into the school
7. Acts of moral turpitude or behaviour unbecoming of a student
8. Carrying or using mobile phones
9. Misuse of Smart Boards
10. Use of motor vehicles such as scooters or mopeds and bringing them to school
11. Theft or pilferage of school or student property
12. Propagating strikes or disruption of classes
13. Association with banned organisations
14. Spitting or littering on school premises
15. Disfiguring or damaging school property
16. Writing on uniforms
17. Smoking or consumption of harmful substances such as gutka or pan masala
18. Gambling in any form
19. **Use of drugs or intoxicants (vaping strictly prohibited)**
20. Rowdy or rude behaviour
21. Violence or bullying in any form (physical or verbal) which may harm any student physically or mentally
22. Cybercrime
23. Discrimination based on caste, religion, or practice of untouchability
24. **Bursting crackers or throwing colours within the school premises**
25. Bunking classes

All the above acts are strictly forbidden. In case of misconduct, the **Principal/HOS** shall take appropriate action based on the recommendations of the Disciplinary Committee. Observance of discipline and good conduct is essential for a student's continuation in the school. In case of breach of discipline by a student, appropriate disciplinary action will be taken as specified under **Disciplinary Measures** on Page 25.

Note: The school reserves the right to modify these rules without prior notice.

Disciplinary Measures

The following measures will be adopted by the school authorities, based on observation and an assessment of the gravity of the misconduct, to enforce discipline. These measures apply to offences pertaining to the aforementioned aspects as well as other acts of indiscipline.

1. Counselling
2. Oral and/or written warning to the student and parents
3. Issue of external memos / show-cause notices
4. Suspension from attending classes/school for a specified period
5. Withdrawal of break / PT periods
6. Community service / social service
7. Withholding or cancellation of results
8. Withdrawal of bus facilities for misbehaviour in the school bus. In such cases, parents will be responsible for dropping and picking up their wards
9. Any loss to school property due to wilful damage shall be made good through replacement of school property and/or imposition of a fine (the amount will be assessed by the school), along with strict disciplinary action
10. Detention during breaks for completion of neglected classwork or homework
11. Rustication or expulsion as per rules, by referring the case to the respective committees
12. Roll numbers / admit cards of students who do not follow school rules or behave in an undisciplined manner may be withheld based on the Code of Conduct issued by CBSE
13. In case a student is found using unfair means during a test or examination, the paper will be cancelled and no re-test will be offered

Note: Violation of any other rule, for which punishment is not prescribed herein, will be dealt with at the discretion of the school authorities after considering the gravity of the misconduct and the past behaviour of the student. The punishment imposed shall be final.

Safety and Security

In accordance with CBSE guidelines, individual committees have been constituted to ensure the safety and security of students. Students, parents, and teachers may email their complaints, if any, to complaints@dpsmathuraroad.org. Once registered, complaints will be addressed effectively by the respective committees. Strict action will be taken against the following offences:

a) Anti-Bullying Committee

Bullying is strictly prohibited within the school premises, and no act of bullying will go unnoticed or unpunished. Bullying may be direct (e.g., physical intimidation or attacks, verbal abuse, unwanted attention or advances, damage to property) or indirect (e.g., spreading malicious rumours). It also includes cyber-bullying (e.g., sending unpleasant SMS messages, photographs, or emails to the victim or others). Guidelines for the Prevention of Bullying and Ragging in Schools, as stated in CBSE Circular No. Acad-17/2015 dated 9 March 2015, have been strictly implemented.

POCSO ACT

The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012, provides protection to children from sexual abuse and prescribes punishment in the form of imprisonment and fines for sexual offences against children. Measures taken by the school as proposed by CBSE include:

- Sensitisation of management and staff regarding the provisions of the POCSO Act
- Self-defence training programmes for girls
- Appropriate training for staff to understand and fulfil their responsibilities in protecting children from abuse
- Police verification and psychometric evaluation of all teaching and non-teaching staff, including bus drivers, conductors, and support staff
- Installation of CCTV cameras across the campus
- Constitution of a parent–teacher–student committee to address student safety concerns
- Monthly safety audits of the school premises conducted by parent representatives and personnel from local police stations
- Display of toll-free numbers and child helpline details on notice boards, along with the names of designated teachers to handle such cases
- Controlled access to the school building for outsiders and monitoring of visitors through a surveillance system at the main gate
- Regular workshops to sensitise students against inappropriate behaviour and encourage immediate reporting of incidents

Attendance

1. It is compulsory for all students to complete 75% attendance before every exam to make them eligible to sit for the examination. In case attendance is short, students will not be eligible for promotion/any academic award.
2. Adequate preparatory leave is given before each exam. It is mandatory for students to attend school till the last working day.
3. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than ten consecutive days renders the student liable to have his/her name struck off the rolls; re-admission may be granted only on payment of fresh admission fee provided the vacancy still exists.
4. All children are expected to attend school on the opening day after every vacation and must be present before closing for the vacations. **Those absent because of sickness must present a medical certificate within 3 days of absence through a representative or on the school's official email ID provided on the school website.**
5. A child returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease should produce a fitness certificate from a doctor.
6. Students suffering from any one of the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to class.
 - i. Chicken pox - Till complete falling of scabs
 - ii. Cholera - Till the child is completely well
 - iii. Measles - Two weeks after the rash disappears
 - iv. Mumps - Until the swelling has gone
 - v. Whooping cough - Six weeks
 - vi. Jaundice - Six weeks
 - vii. H1N1 - Six weeks
 - viii. Swine Flu - Six weeks
 - ix. Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease – Till complete recovery
 - x. Conjunctivitis - Till redness, discharge, and watering of eyes have resolved
7. Only those students will be put 'On Duty' who represent the school while playing a tournament, a sport or participate in any other event. Any student, not representing the school, will have no such claim.
8. Proper permission by the Event In-charge, duly signed by Vice Principal (Administration), must be carried by students 'On Duty'.
9. In case of long, uninformed absence on the part of a Board Examinee, three external memos would be issued followed by a show-cause notice and the matter would be sent to the CBSE for further action.

Criteria for Academic Awards for the Year 2026-2027

The **eligibility criteria** for being declared a SCHOLAR is as follows

- **Minimum Attendance: 80%** for Classes VI-X
75% for Classes XI-XII
- **Scholastic Areas:**
 - **Classes VI- VIII: 85% and above** in all subjects including the 3rd language
 - **Classes IX- X: 85% and above** in all five **main academic** subjects.
 - **Class XI: 80% and above** in all five academic subjects.
 - **Class XII: 8-Years Scholar (from Class IV to Class XI in succession)** and **securing at least 4 A1s** in the Board Exams (AISSCE).
- **Co- Scholastic Areas:**
 - **Classes VI- XII:** The student must score a minimum **Grade A** in each: SEWA project/Work Experience (SUPW)/ Art Education/ Health and Physical Education/ Life Skills/ Yoga/ General Studies.

Note:-

* 2020-2021(except class X and XII) and 2021-2022 (except class X and XII) will be considered as zero years for calculating 6 years, 8 years and 9 years scholar.

* No proximity criterion will be applicable for the Board Results of Class X (AISSE) and XII (AISSCE). CBSE Board Result will be considered as final and binding.

**Marks secured in the 6th subject will not be considered for the eligibility criteria for being declared a Scholar. Neither will it be considered for Subject Proficiency Marker Cup in classes VI-IX & XI nor the Principal's Commendation Medal for subject proficiency in classes X & XII.*

*The school shall be the custodian of the declared awards for a period of one academic year from the date of Annual Award Ceremony (Scholar Badge Ceremony) for the respective class.

**The students who have taken a transfer (TC) from the school will not be eligible for accolades during the Annual Award Ceremony.

The following students will not be eligible for receiving any Academic Award:

- A student who is guilty of breaching the school rules and indulging in misconduct such as indiscipline, bullying, fighting, cheating, using foul/ abusive language, etc.
- **A student who is found in possession of a mobile phone and smart watch in school.**
- A student who has appeared for any Retest/ Re Exam.

Criteria for being considered a Scholar for New Admissions:

- Only students of Delhi Public Schools (core/ satellite) are eligible.
- The student will be eligible for any academic accolade only after completing **one** academic year at DPS Mathura Road.
- He/ she must submit the following documents with a covering letter to the Class Rep by July 31, 2026:
 - Photocopy of Result of the qualifying class issued by the last school attended; in case of Class X, Mark Sheet issued by CBSE.
 - Copy of all the previous Scholar Certificates received from the school last attended.

*The academic achievements of the student in his/her past school collected above will be considered to determine the number of scholar years of the students since he/she joined DPS Mathura Road.

** The number of scholar years will be determined as per the eligibility criteria of DPS Mathura Road, New Delhi.

(The decision of the School Committee is final and binding.)

Important Guidelines for Board Examinees (X and XII)

Registration

Students studying in schools affiliated to CBSE and desirous of availing the exemptions / concessions should approach the concerned regional office of CBSE through the Head of their Institution preferably while in Class IX and / or XI. The request should be supported by the relevant medical certificate and recommendation from the Head of the School / Institution. Only those students would be considered for grant of exemption / concession in whose respect relevant category has been entered during registration in Class IX and / or XI.

Exam Preparation

- You know your strengths and weaknesses the best – Plan your entire schedule around your strong and weak points. Give more time to the topics you're less thorough with.
- In the board exams, you'll see a pattern of questions asked repeatedly. Be thorough with those and prepare according to the paper style.
- Sleep well a night before the exam and have a healthy breakfast the next morning.
- The candidates must visit the examination centre at least one day prior to the date of examination so that they can reach before 10:00 A.M. on the days of examination.
- The candidates should leave for the examination centre keeping in view weather conditions, traffic conditions, etc.
- Have faith in your hard work and your preparations.

During the Exam

- All the candidates need to appear for the exam in school uniform.
- Students must compulsorily carry their school IDs to the Examination Centre without which entry into the centre is not permitted.
- Students must carry their stationery. (Blue/Royal Blue Ink/Ball Point/Gel Pen (3-4), pencil, eraser, sharpener, ruler, etc.) in a transparent stationery pouch.
- Students may carry a transparent writing board (board on which the answer sheet is attached to write the exam).
- Barred Items: Textual material (printed or written), bits of papers, pen drives, calculator, log table, electronic pen/scanner, etc. are not allowed to be carried into the examination hall. Any communication device – such as mobile phone, bluetooth, earphones, microphone, pager, health band, camera, analog or digital watches, etc. are not allowed.
- Students must not write / put their name / signature or any other sign or mark which may disclose their identity to the examiner, anywhere in the answer book.

- Presentation of the paper is important:
 - ▶ Handwriting must be neat and legible.
 - ▶ Proper spacing must be maintained between the words and lines so that it's easy for the examiner to comprehend the answers.
 - ▶ Diagrams should be drawn only with a pencil and the labelling must be done with pencil only.
 - ▶ Effort should be made to write the answers in points. Bunching all sentences together must be avoided. At least two lines must be left before and after each question so that in case of wanting to add content later, there's enough space left.

- **Time Management is essential:**
 - ▶ Make good use of the 15 minutes reading time.
 - ▶ Read the question paper carefully so that you can organise your thoughts and manage your time well through the exam.
 - ▶ While writing the paper, adhere to the word limit and time limit to be allocated for attempting questions of different weightage.
 - ▶ Do not spend more time on a section that carries relatively less marks.
 - ▶ In numerical questions, copy the data correctly from the question paper, or from one step of the problem to the next. Also, do convert the data into appropriate units.
 - ▶ Do not waste time on questions you are not sure of or those which are time consuming.
 - ▶ Come back to answer them only when you are through with all that you know.
 - ▶ Don't get distracted by any external factors.
 - ▶ Keep some time for revision and check whether you have answered all the questions you know.
 - ▶ Diagrams, where required, should be neat and labelled.

Instructions for Students During Examinations

1. Students must report to school on time on examination days and proceed directly to their allotted examination venue.
2. Students must come in proper school uniform with their school identity card. They should occupy only their allotted seats and keep examination materials in a transparent pouch.
3. Students arriving late will not be granted any extra time.
4. Students must bring their own stationery items and a transparent water bottle. Borrowing, lending, or exchanging any material during the examination is strictly prohibited.
5. Students must write their name, roll number, class, and section in the top right corner of the question paper. No rough work is to be done on the question paper.
6. Only essential writing materials are permitted on the desk. All bags, books, and other belongings must be kept at the front of the classroom.
7. Students are strictly prohibited from carrying any electronic gadgets such as mobile phones, calculators, smart watches, or communication devices to the examination venue. If any such item is found in a student's possession, it will be confiscated on a non-returnable basis, and strict disciplinary action will be taken.
8. Students are not permitted to leave the examination room without the invigilator's permission. No student will be allowed to leave the room during the first half hour and the last half hour of the examination.
9. No supplementary answer sheets will be issued during the last five minutes of the examination.
10. During the examination, students must maintain complete silence and discipline, and strictly follow the instructions of the invigilator. Any form of misbehavior, disobedience, or unruly conduct will result in immediate disciplinary action.
11. A student shall be deemed to have used unfair means if he/she:
 - Possesses papers, books, notes, calculators, electronic gadgets, communication devices, or any material related to the subject of examination.
 - Gives or receives assistance directly or indirectly, or attempts to do so (both parties will be punished).
 - Writes questions or answers on any material other than the answer book.
 - Tears any page from the answer book or supplementary sheet.
 - Communicates or attempts to communicate with anyone other than the invigilator during the examination.
 - Takes the answer book out of the examination room.
 - Smuggles out the answer book, supplementary sheet, or any part thereof.
 - Uses or attempts to use any other unfair or undesirable means in connection with the examination. In all such cases, the paper will be cancelled and the student will be awarded zero marks for that examination.
12. After the examination, students must leave the hall quickly and quietly, ensuring they take all their belongings with them.
